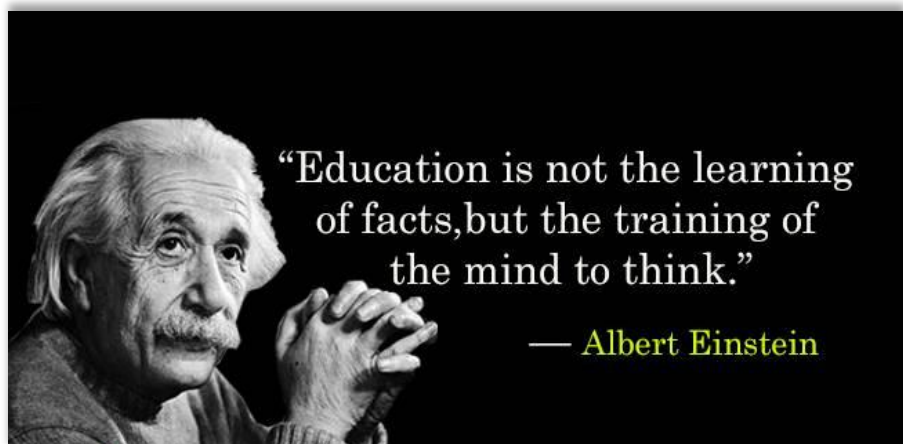


# It is APR (April) Again!

The APR serves as a platform to obtain feedback and involvement of various input from stakeholders such as external examiners, industry advisory panel, employers and students.

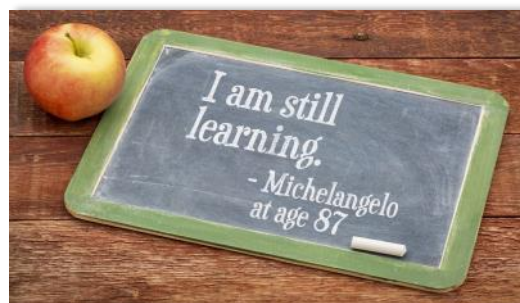
